



Rev'd Canon Andrew Holliday (Chair)

Andrew has been the Rector of Standish St. Wilfrid since 2011. In September 2012, he was made a Canon of Blackburn Cathedral. He has served curacies in Blackpool and Poulton-le-Fylde; his first Incumbency was at St James' Leyland in 1997, where he was Area Dean from 2002 - 2004. In 2004, he was appointed to the Team Ministry of St. Peter's, Darwen with St. Paul's, Hoddlesden.
